

CHAPTER 2.0

SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT PLAN

2.1 INTRODUCTION

Tarlac City is on top of the hierarchy of settlements having the most number of both urban and rural dwellers within Tarlac province and is projected to remain so until year 2008.

Population in the city is largely attributed to in-migration. It is expected to double by year 2027.

The figures on population indicate that provision of adequate social services capable of meeting the needs of this growing and dynamic citizenry remain high. Availability of these services to the poor and disadvantaged population is even more critical.

The City Government is mainly responsible for the delivery of these services to the people. Line agencies as the Departments of Health, Education and Culture, Social Welfare and Development, among others, complement its efforts in providing these social services.

The City works for the promotion of social service programs and projects aimed at building better quality of life, especially for the poor and disadvantaged sectors of the population. Health and nutrition, education, culture and sports, socialized housing and resettlements, protective services as well as their corresponding infrastructure requirements need to be adequately distributed in the City's urban and rural barangays.

2.2 MAJOR GOAL

The people are able to meet and sustain their minimum basic needs of adequate food, good health, education, shelter and human dignity when their productive capacity is adequately harnessed to the national and international level of competitiveness.

2.3 HOUSING

A. EXISTING SITUATION

Shelter is one of man's basic needs. Demand for new housing units in Tarlac City is quite high, largely due to its increasing population. Increase in housing demand is expected especially in the city's growth areas and resettlement areas like Sapang Maragul and San Rafael.

In 2000, Tarlac City's population is 262, 481, composed by a total of 51,703 households occupying about 50,200 dwelling units. The ratio indicates the existence of double-up HHs and a shortage of 1,503 units. With the present number of dwelling units, it is assumed that 20% of these need improvement.

There are 85 subdivisions in Tarlac City.

The effect of Mt. Pinatubo's eruption in 1991 is still a major concern for the City. The need for a resettlement area for affected households remains one of the administration's priority tasks.

Major issues affecting the housing sub-sector include urban poor families residing in danger zones (e.g. riparian community built-up along Tarlac River) or squatting in properties whose owners are not open to selling the same.

B. GOAL

Adequate, affordable and decent low-cost housing, livelihood and suitable relocation sites provided to squatters and low-income families

C. OBJECTIVES

1. To provide credit assistance for housing with low amortization rate and longer repayment period
2. To encourage private and government sector partnership and collaboration in responding to the housing demand/needs of the City.
3. To promote the use of indigenous materials in the construction of houses.

D. TARGETS

1. Construction of low-cost housing units accessible to transportation lines, schools and provided with basic utilities such as water and electricity.

E. STRATEGIES

1. Encourage families to avail of the lending windows of GSIS, SSS, PAG-IBIG for housing loans.
2. Improvement of housing delivery system of the government.
3. Effective documentation of the housing needs of the populace.
4. Coordination with the National Housing Authority (NHA) to avail of its funding assistance for development of the City's resettlement area.
5. Strengthening existing cooperatives to enable them to have alliance with the private sector NGOs and POs anchored on the principle of active partnership.
6. Reduce the cost of housing loan acquisition by reducing too much bureaucracy.

F. PLANS, PROGRAMS PROJECTS

Local Initiative Housing Program

Local government initiates construction of houses purely out of local materials solicited from the private sector. Indigenous materials obtained through donations from suppliers and businessmen would be utilized for the houses to be built under a government housing program.

G. LAND USE IMPLICATIONS

The proposed program under this sub-sector would require an allocation of 8.5 % of the city's total residential area.

2.4 EDUCATION

A. EXISTING SITUATION

A well-educated citizenry is a prerequisite to the development of the City. Poor access to education in terms of distance to schools and financial capability of families to send their children to school are the major educational problems. Corollary to this citizenry depends highly on the kind of education being injected to them for their development by the different educational institutions existing in the city.

Formal education in Tarlac City is being undertaken by both public and private schools. As of school year 2001–2002, the city has 102 elementary schools, out of this 86 are public and 16 are privately owned.

Likewise, there are 22 secondary schools, where 8 are public and 14 are private schools.

During the school year 2001-2002, the total enrollment in the elementary level was 46,133, 85% of which accounts for public school enrollees while 15% accounts for private school enrollees.

It is important to note that the public schools exhibited the highest rate of enrollment and these are Tarlac West Central Elementary School and Sto. Cristo Elementary School with 3,256 and 2,219, respectively.

Also on the same school year, registered enrollment in the secondary level is 22,082. Tarlac National High School, a public school has the highest number of enrollees with 7,324.

There are four (4) schools that offer Tertiary education: Tarlac State University and three (3) private schools:

1. College of the Holy Spirit
2. Osias Colleges
3. Central Luzon Doctor's Hospital

Comparing the current total number of pupils against the total number of classrooms in the elementary level, the average ratio is 1:38, meaning based on the standard ratio of classroom to pupils, the present number of classroom in some public elementary schools are already sufficient. However, 26 public elementary schools are in need of 106 classrooms.

In the secondary level, the average classroom student ratio is 1:65. Based on the standard ratio of 1:40, there is a current need of 175 classrooms.

Likewise, comparing the total number of students to the number of schoolteachers using the standard ratio of one (1) teacher for every 40 pupils in elementary level indicates there is a current need for 51 additional public school teachers. At the public secondary level, the total number of 494 teachers is also below the standard ratio and presents a need for 15 additional teachers.

B. GOAL

1. Better quality of education which is responsive and dynamic to the needs of the whole community.

C. OBJECTIVES

1. To enhance the educational system in the City by raising the quality of instruction at all levels.
2. To assist school-age drop-outs acquire vocational aptitudes and receive relevant training opportunities.
3. To increase literacy rate among out-of-school youths and adults

D. TARGETS

1. Construction of 106 classrooms in the elementary level and 175 classrooms in the secondary level to meet the standard ratio of classroom to students and expanding access on both elementary and secondary level for hard to reach population.
2. Upgrading of existing primary schools to elementary school and providing elementary school in every barangay.
3. Coordination and establishment of linkages with national agencies (i.e. NMYC and DTI) for the provision of skills training program for the out-of-school youths.
4. Hiring of 51 elementary level teachers and 15 secondary level teachers to meet the teacher requirements.

E. STRATEGIES

1. Collaboration between the Department of Education (DepEd) and the City Government in hiring additional teachers and for the acquisition of needed facilities, most especially laboratories, libraries, comfort rooms, playgrounds, guidance office, and the like to make educational instruction more effective and functional.
2. Regular staff development activities to upgrade the competencies and maximize full potentials of schoolteachers.

F. PLANS, PROGRAMS AND PROJECTS

Educational Facilities Upgrading Program

There is an increasing gap in the proportion of classrooms to students due to the increasing enrollment and slow improvement, construction and repair of school buildings. Continuous review and evaluation of the required sites and facilities to meet the learning needs of the students are necessary. Requirements in the area of school site such as classrooms and textbooks which are based on projected enrollment should be addressed properly. Moreover, schools need to be equipped with facilities, equipment and related materials necessary to capitalize on technological advancements focused on science and technology and communication arts education. The City Government will exert efforts to facilitate the acquisition of books and laboratory equipment to further improve the competencies of students. Construction of classrooms in urban growth areas shall likewise receive priority attention.

Educational Manpower Resource Development Program

There should be a continuing program to upgrade teaching and instructional competencies of both teachers and administrators through various staff development training and seminars, particularly in values education, science and technology, and communication arts education.

The City should also maintain adequate number of educators deployed in various schools. A total of 300 teachers should be hired from 2003-2010.

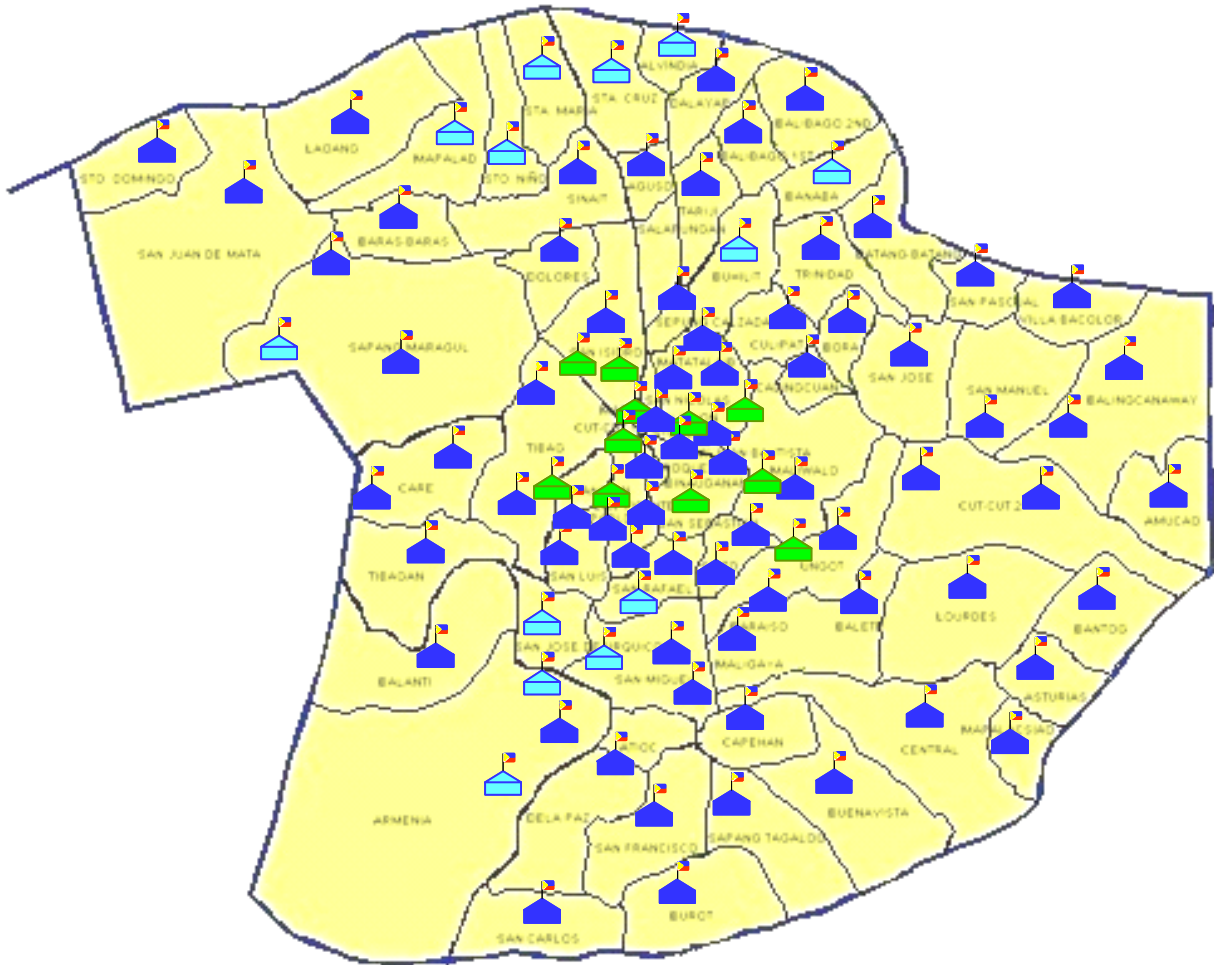
Curriculum Enrichment Program

This program will address the need to improve the quality, effectiveness and efficiency of the City's educational system. This would require basically the development /acquisition of appropriate teaching strategies and production of upgraded instructional materials using non-traditional and indigenous materials.

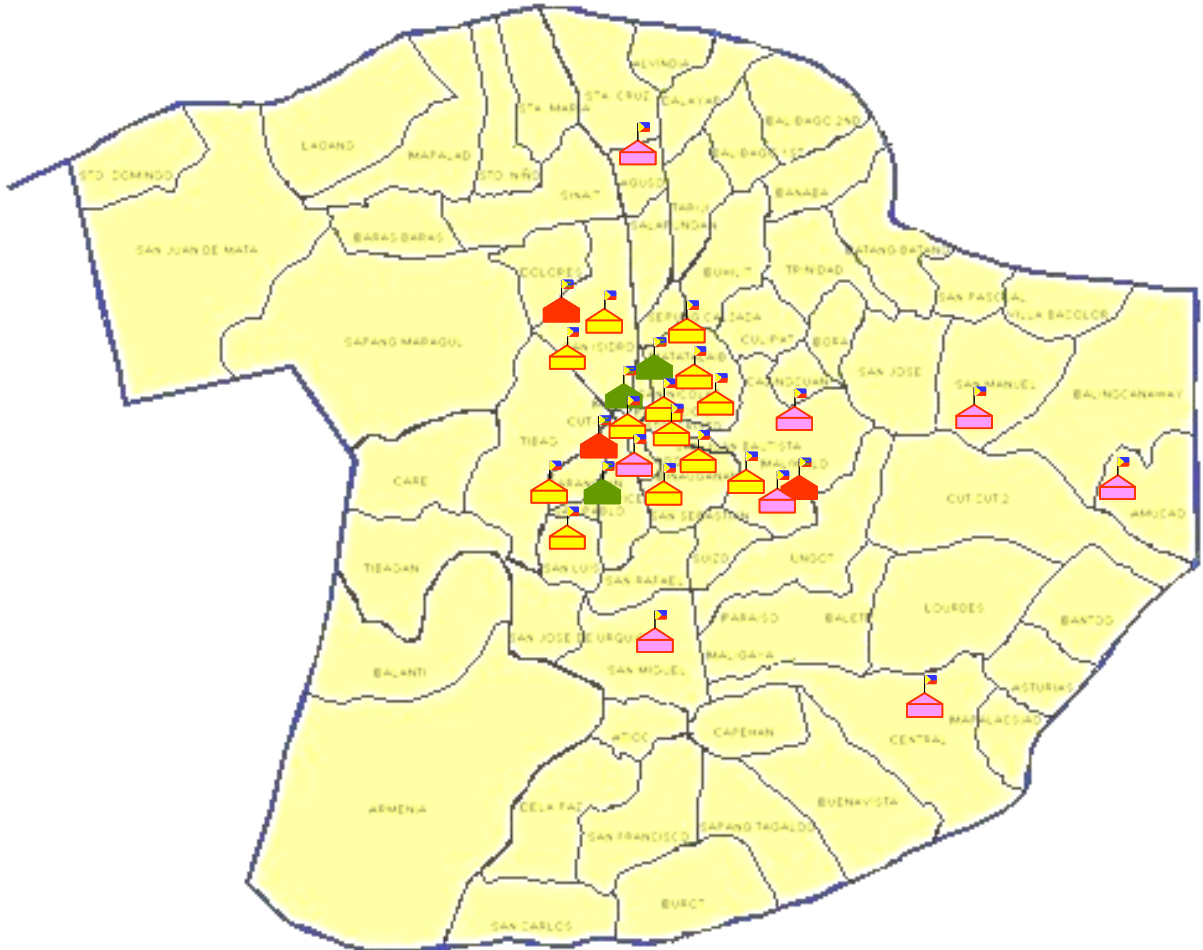

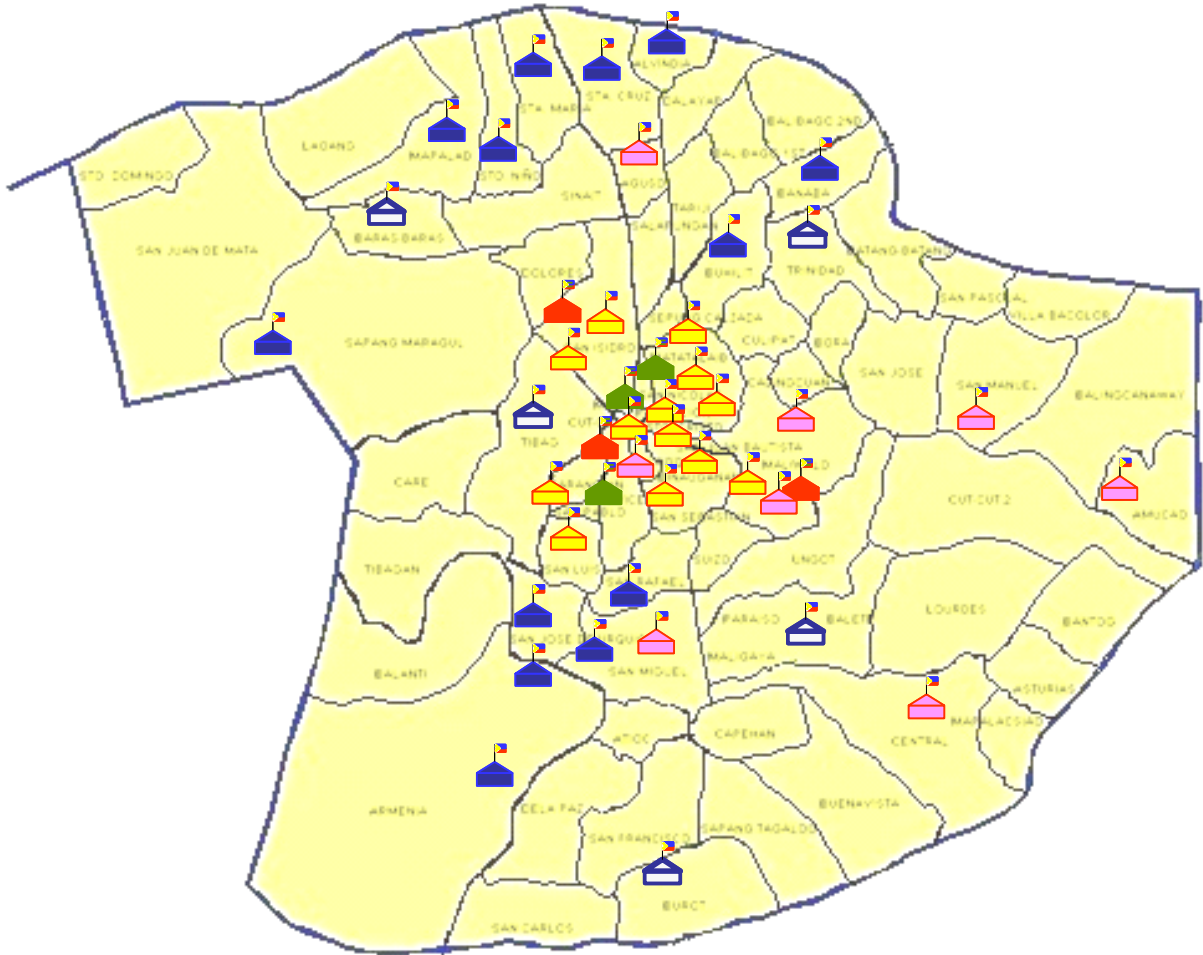

G. LAND USE IMPLICATIONS

This sub-sector would require allocation of areas for new secondary schools in the City's growth areas and in the rural areas. This will also include the areas needed for expansion of present sub-standard school sites in urban areas.

2.5 HEALTH AND NUTRITION

A. EXISTING SITUATION

Health and nutrition is considered an integral part of the overall socio-economic development because a healthy citizenry leads to more productivity and increased income. When income increases, access to other socio-economic needs improve which eventually leads to overall development.

Inadequate health services and facilities are among the major concerns of this sub-sector. Available data reveal inadequate number of physicians, nurses, and other health personnel. Inadequate health services also have social justice implications. Due to poverty, the poor and the disadvantaged families could not afford private hospitals or medical services. A number of them die without receiving any medical attention.

The Tarlac Provincial Hospital is a 200-bed government hospital located in Barangay San Vicente with a service area covering the City of Tarlac and other of towns of Tarlac province. It has a staff complement of sixty-seven (67) physicians, five (5) dentists, sixty-three (63) nurses, three (3) midwives, three (3) pharmacists, three (3) nutritionists, nine (9) medical technologists and four (4) x-ray technicians.

There are four (4) private hospitals with a total bed capacity of 345 and a military hospital inside the Camp Aquino with 98-bed capacity.

The City has six (6) Rural Health Units:

On Nutrition, Rural Health Units registered around 15,360 or 31.75% malnourished children out of 48,383 children weighed in 2000. The 15,360 malnourished children, 12,444 or 25.72% are first degree malnourished, 2,534 or 5.24% are second degree malnourished and 382 or 0.79% third degree malnourished. Study revealed that while the City is self-sufficient in rice, meat/fish/poultry and vegetables, there is a very low level of awareness on proper nutrition and the implications of non-balanced diets especially among children.

Cardio vascular diseases ranked first among the leading causes of death. Other causes of mortality are PTB, cancer of all forms, pneumonia, bronchial asthma/emphysema, kidney diseases, septicemia/sepsis, diabetes, premature births and liver diseases.

Meanwhile, the ten causes of morbidity are Upper Respiratory Infection, diarrhea, Anemia, gastro-intestinal disorders, nutritional and other vitamin deficiency, skin problem, bronchitis, parasitism, influenza, and PTB.

Family planning is widely accepted in the city. Common means of birth control among married couples are pills, DMPA, condom, LAM, NFP, IUD and Female Sterilization.

B. GOAL

1. Improve and safeguard the general health condition of the city's population.

C. OBJECTIVES

1. To construct health infrastructure and upgrade medical facilities to adequately respond to the population needs and to acquire additional medical equipment to meet the needs of the Rural Health Units and the hospital.
2. To beef up the medical staff complement of the RHUs to ensure a more efficient and effective delivery of health services.
3. To intensify efforts on environmental sanitation particularly those related to the water supply and water disposal systems.
4. To implement more nutrition programs to address the alarming level of malnutrition among children.
5. To limit population growth to an acceptable level.

D. TARGETS

1. Reduce malnutrition incidence from 31.75% to 0% by year 2010.
2. Equip the existing Provincial Hospital with upgraded, well functioning facilities by year 2005.
3. Construct six (6) Rural Health Units for the period 2002-2010.
4. Construction of City Medical Hospital with laboratory facilities to augment the services being provided by the Provincial Hospital.
5. Purchase of complete medical equipment for the RHUs for the period 2001-2010.

E. STRATEGIES

1. Encourage people participation in health care services.
2. Encourage parents and barangay officials to participate in the City's Nutrition Program.
3. Encourage and strengthen partnership arrangement with other local government agencies, the private sector, and NGOs in the delivery of basic health services.
4. Provide access to sanitary toilets, sewerage and safe drinking water.

5. Train and maintain technically qualified and highly motivated public health workers especially those in the rural barangays.
6. Intensify existing programs on disease control, sanitation, disaster management, surveillance, health promotion, advocacy and health monitoring and evaluation.
7. Continued implementation of Nutrition program in conjunction with advocacy and info campaigns to educate mothers on the importance of proper nutrition especially among young children

F. PLANS, PROGRAMS PROJECTS

Infrastructure & Manpower Development Program

This program shall involve:

Establishment of additional Rural Health Units in a strategic location and providing them complete health equipment.

Hiring of additional community health workers and doctors for the RHUs to be constructed.

Skills training in handling medical cases among nurses, midwives and attendants.

Enhancement of Existing Sanitation and Hygiene Program

This program will involve information and education campaigns on sanitation and hygiene. It aims to solve health problems on the spread of environmental and sanitation-related diseases.

Expanded Health and Nutrition Program

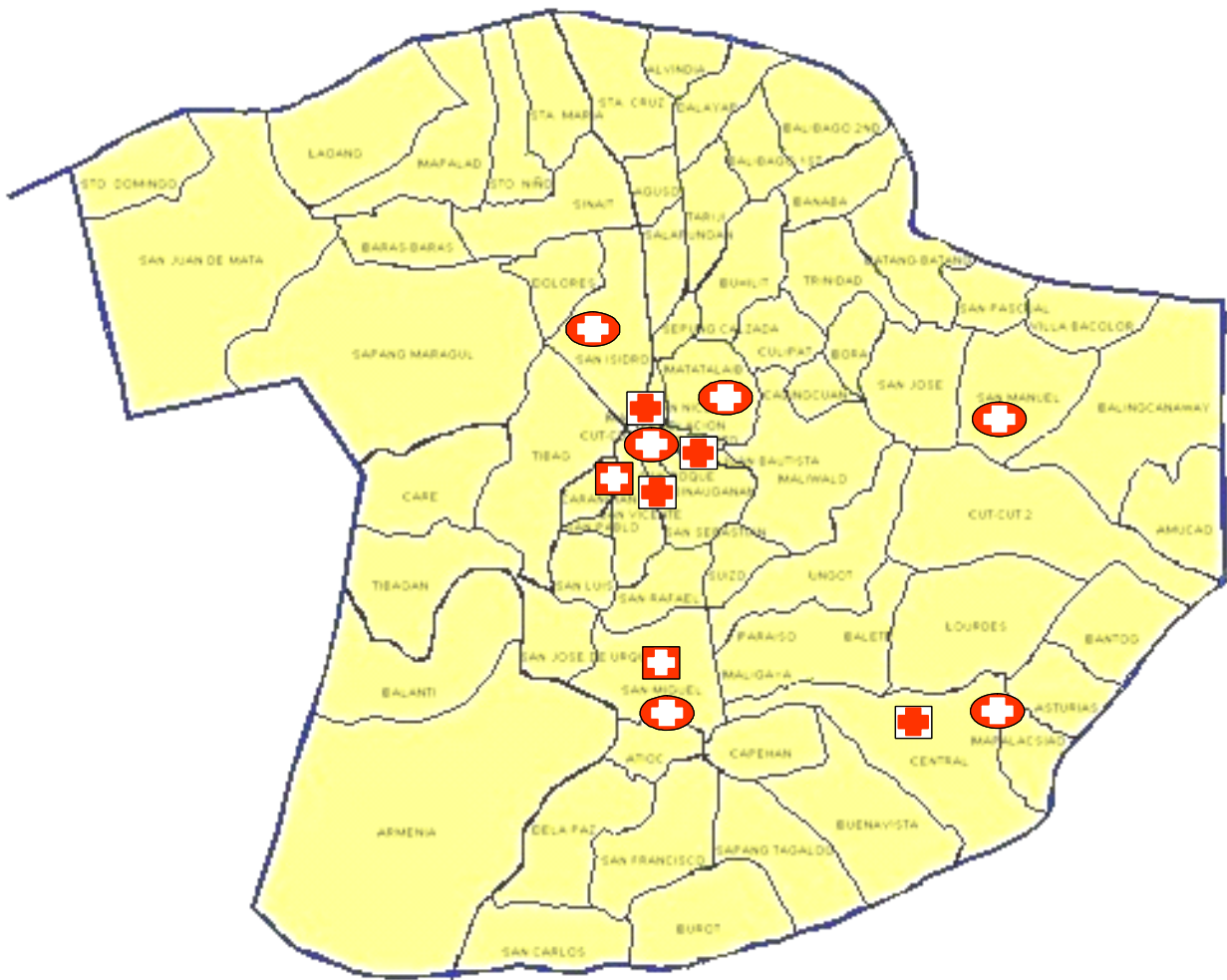
This program entails the continuation of the existing City Health and Nutrition Program. Nutrition program includes Food Production, Micro-Nutrients Supplementation and Supplemental Food Provision to 2nd and 3rd degree malnourished children, Food Fortification, Nutrition Education and Information.

Health care programs entail continuation and intensification of existing health programs mandated by the Department of Health.

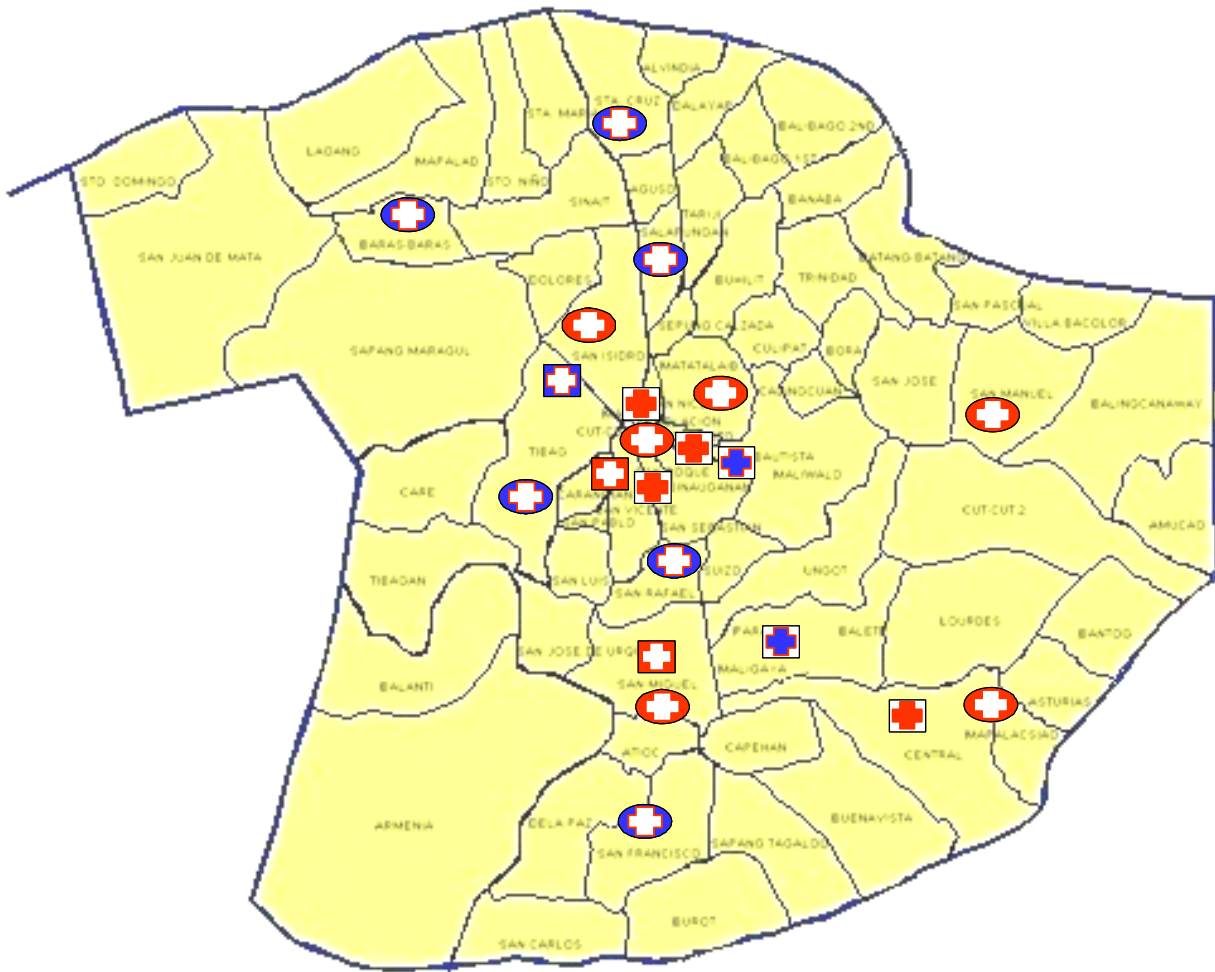




**INFRASTRUCTURE PLAN MAP YEAR 2010

Identification of areas for the construction of additional RHUs for the identified barangays should be properly carried out.

2.6 SPORTS AND RECREATION

A. EXISTING SITUATION

The promotion of sports and recreation is also a primary concern of Tarlac City. The government has to provide facilities and opportunities for the youth, disabled, senior citizens and adults to spend their leisure hours through wholesome activities.

Existing sports facilities in the City consist of three (3) gymnasiums, 76 basketball courts, one (1) baseball/softball field, one (1) pelota court, one (1) golf course, three (3) tennis courts, four (4) swimming pool/resorts and one (1) football field.

In terms of recreational facilities, the City has six (6) parks and playgrounds, eleven (11) movie houses, one (1) public library, one (1) bowling center and one (1) cockpit. The parks are located at the Poblacion, San Miguel, San Nicolas and San Vicente while the playground is in San Sebastian.

The City lacks varied sports and recreation facilities that cater to both the adult and the young populations. The gymnasiums are mostly within school premises, preventing residents to have access during weekends. There is a need for a public gymnasium or a public hall where physical fitness activities or other productive social gatherings could be initiated for and by the residents.

B. GOAL

1. Institutionalization of sports and physical fitness as an important aspect of community life.

C. OBJECTIVES

1. Promote physical, intellectual and social well-being of the citizenry in terms of competitive recreational and physical fitness activities.
2. Provide adequate sports facilities and improve existing recreational facilities to develop community awareness in the importance of physical fitness and development

D. TARGETS

1. Completion of beautification and establishment of regular maintenance schedule for parks and plazas by within the planning period.
2. Improvement of all existing basketball courts in the barangays and provision of covered basketball court to selected schools within the planning period.
3. Promotion of sports physical fitness by staging various competitions among physical fitness clubs.

E. STRATEGIES

1. Establish identified needed recreational infrastructure both in urban the urban center and growth center
2. Encourage private investors to engage in sports and recreational activities/facilities
3. Provide and sustain community-wide sports programs and projects city-wide particularly those that are appropriate to the City's resources.
4. Promote the development of strong community sports associations, clubs and groups.

F. PLANS, PROGRAMS PROJECTS

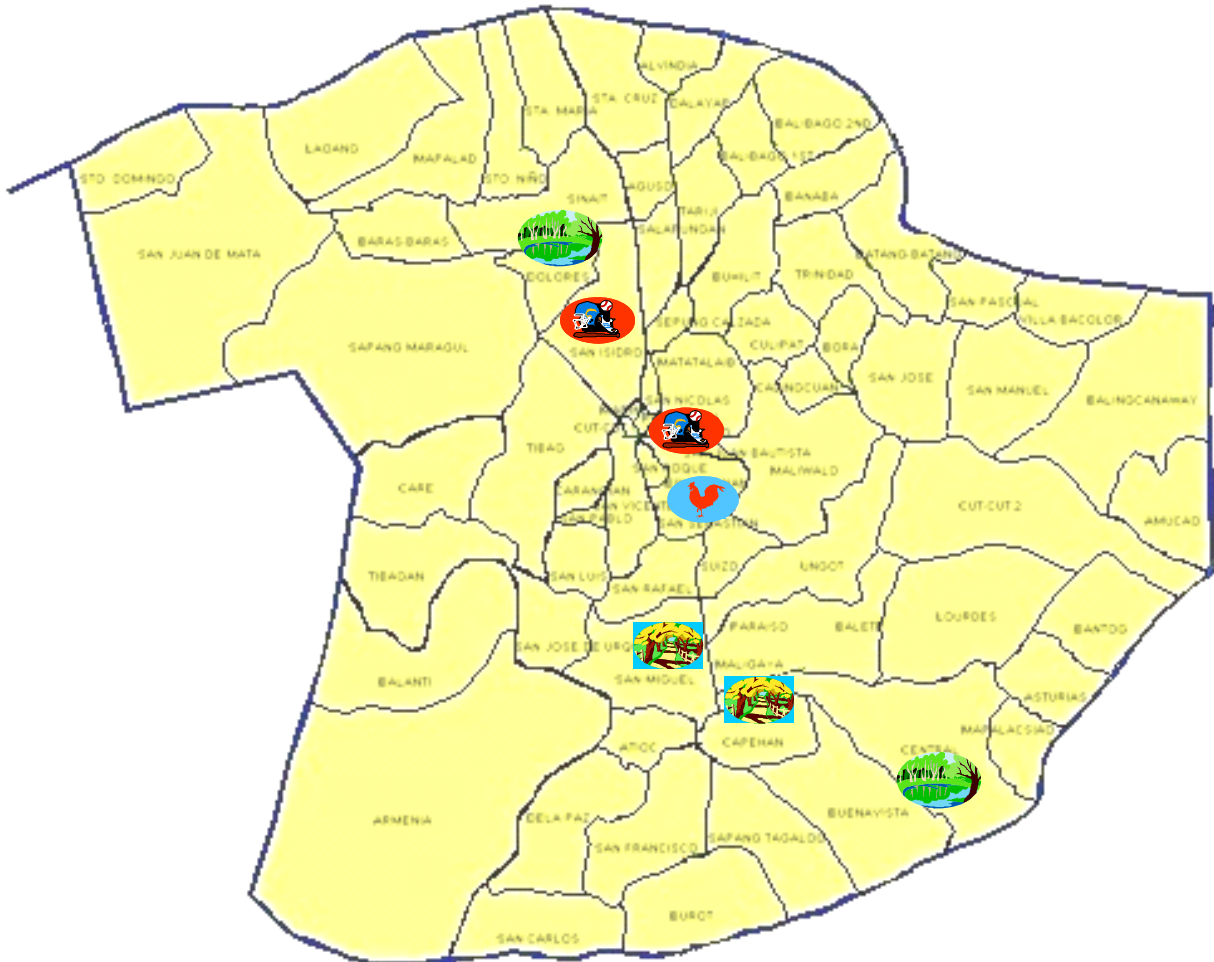
Inter-Barangay Sports Development Program

Under this program, development of more types of sports other than basketball will be undertaken. City and barangay resources shall be tapped to finance inter-barangay competitions on various types of sports. This shall also include promotional campaign of games and provision of subsidies for barangay sports activities.

COMPREHENSIVE LAND USE PLAN

Sports and Recreational Manpower Upgrading

This program includes sponsoring various sports training such as chess, badminton, sepak takraw, arnis, etc. It will also include sports training for coaches and staff and provision of incentives to athletes, coaches and trainers.

Sports Facilities Development Program

This program includes the improvement of existing barangay basketball court by providing a covered structure and sports facilities; also, selective schools will be provided a covered basketball court to sustain the sports development program for the youth.

G. LAND USE IMPLICATIONS

Land allocation for the development of recreational facilities for the youth, adult and women in rural barangays particularly multi-purpose courts for volleyball, badminton, etc.

Sports facilities that could not be provided to every barangay may be provided to barangay clusters.

2.7 PROTECTIVE SERVICES

A. EXISTING SITUATION

Police and Fire Department Services play vital roles in the promotion of safety and prevention of crimes and man-made calamities within any locality. The peace and order situation is critical to all aspects of development.

Tarlac City PNP has a 138 man-complement composed of seven (7) PCOs and one hundred and thirty-one (131) NCOs, who are supported by three (3) NUPs.

The PNP Headquarters is located in Rizal St., Brgy. Cut-Cut 1st while eight (8) other sub-stations are located in Barangays Salapungan, Mabini, Maliwalo, San Miguel, Tibag, San Isidro, Mapalacsiao and San Sebastian.

The police force is supported by 680 barangay Bantay Bayan in maintaining peace and order.

To enable it to perform its functions, it has 8 mobile cars, 157 firearms, 12, 502 rounds of ammunition, 10 mobile radios.

For CY 2000 there is a slight increase in the index crime volume committed. From a crime rate of 4.48 for CY 1999 to a crime rate of 4.77 for CY 2000 or about 6.45% increase. For non-index crime rate, 13.02 for CY 1999 to a rate of 8.75 for CY 2000, a decrease of about 33%.

For the year 2001, the most number of crimes committed were on violation of Special Laws that include violation of RA 6425, PD 1602, Forestry and Pilferage Acts (water and electricity), respectively.

Theft and robbery are commonly committed by offenders belonging to the very poor sector although there are recorded incidents of robberies committed by members of the Akyat-Bahay Gang who are even residents of the City. It has also been observed that there are violators who are non-residents but have contacts residing within the City

The number of policemen is definitely inadequate for the City's population. The ratio of 1: 1902 is very much below the ideal police to population ratio of 1:500 and minimum ratio of 1: 1000 (HLURB Guidelines). Police visibility is inadequate in rural barangays but the actual demand is lesser compared to urban areas where population is more dense and peace and order is more difficult to ensure.

The Fire Department on the other hand is manned by twenty (20) firemen and eight (8) civilians. It has five (5) trucks, only three (3) of which are operational, the remaining two (2) requiring repair. There is another one (1) unit functioning which is a joint undertaking of the City Government and the Filipino-Chinese Fire Brigade.

In the year 2000, there were 13 number of alarms, causing property losses valued at P 7, 662,000.00 without any recorded injuries.

B. GOAL

1. Safety, peace and order adequately maintained by a network of qualified, disciplined and dedicated law enforcers and protective services staff

C. OBJECTIVES

1. To maintain peace and order in the city and safeguard the people against disorder and social ills.
2. To improve law enforcement system and capability in maintaining peace and order in the City.
3. To protect the people from potential damage to properties and lives brought about by fire and other man-triggered calamities.
4. To increase protective personnel and facilities to meet the current and projected needs of the City.

D. TARGETS

1. Reduce crime incidence by at least 5 % each succeeding year.
2. Prevention of fire incidents and other man-triggered calamities.
3. Come up with ratio of 1 policeman to 500 population and 1 fireman to 2000 population.
4. Acquisition of land for the site and construction of the Tarlac City Jail.
5. Establishment of a rehabilitation center for drug dependents.

E. STRATEGIES

1. Increasing police visibility in crime-prone and traffic-prone areas and rural barangays.
2. Strengthening PNP/ Civic Groups/NGO collaboration in the campaign of policemen and firemen on handling traffic, crime-solving and fire control/prevention.
3. Sustaining efforts on anti-criminality operations by soliciting public support and cooperation through regular dialogues with the local residents.
4. Intensifying anti-drug campaign operations particularly in drug-affected barangays in collaboration with NGOs and civic organizations.

F. PLANS, PROGRAMS AND PROJECTS

Police and Fire Protection Manpower Development Program

This program involves regular hiring of additional policemen and firemen based on the acceptable standard ratio to population as well as the training and re-training of policemen and firemen on handling traffic, crime-solving and fire control/prevention.

Community volunteerism shall be encouraged through proper training and provision of regular incentives to CVOs, PNP personnel and Fire officers. This shall also include updating of training on Management information System, Community Awareness on Crime, Fire Prevention, etc.

Infrastructure Development Program

This program involves the construction of a Fire Department Building and Tarlac City Jail, and the establishment of a rehabilitation center through the collaboration of NGOs and civic organizations.

G. LAND USE IMPLICATIONS

The construction of a new Fire Department Building in Barangay San Sebastian and acquisition of land for the Tarlac City Jail. The establishment of a rehabilitation center for drug dependents.

Next Physical Injuries which is mostly committed by offenders while under the influence of liquor.

Robbery and theft are commonly committed by offenders living beyond poverty line although there are incidents committed by the so-called Akyat Bahay Gang but not residing in the City nor in the province. On the other hand, there are times violators have residence contact person in the city.

2.8 SOCIAL WELFARE AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

A. EXISTING SITUATION

Social welfare as a government function which provides the backbone of community action to cater to the civic responsibilities of the government to its populace, particularly the poor.

At present, the City Social Welfare and Development Office has three (3) social welfare officers, two (2) welfare aides, eighty-seven (87) day care workers and one (1) clerk.

The current programs and services under this office are those under the Bureau of Family and Community Welfare (BFCW), Bureau of Child and Youth Welfare (BCYW), Bureau of Women Welfare (BWW), Bureau of Disabled and Elderly and Bureau of Emergency Assistance (BEA).

There are ninety (90) Day Care Centers located in the different barangays. Some of these DCCs have their own buildings while others use existing barangay halls or barangay centers.

There are two (2) identified depressed barangays, Sto. Domingo and Laoang.

This CSWDO is supported by private/civic organizations in the extension of social services to the residents of the entire City.

B. GOAL

1. Empowered citizens responsive, unified and committed to self and community development for a much improved quality of life

C. OBJECTIVES

1. To strengthen participation of women with full equal rights in the development of the City.
2. To enable the disadvantaged and handicapped sectors of the population enhance self-function, productive skills and participation in economic /social activities.
3. To support the promotion and protection of children's right.

D. TARGETS

1. Participation of women in the labor force to reach 50% of the population by year 2010.
2. Access to income-generating activities provided to disadvantaged and handicapped sectors by year 2010.
3. Formulate strategic framework for plan development for children (CHILD 21) by year 2005.

E. STRATEGIES

1. Improve access to social services and facilities to residents through the promotion of integrated social welfare package.
2. Promote and sustain interpersonal relationships within and among families to ensure the creation of an enabling and child-friendly society.
3. Facilitate employment of indigent but qualified workers in the city.

F. PLANS, PROGRAMS, PROJECTS

Integrated Social Welfare Package Development

This package aims to enhance existing social welfare programs and services in the city. Strong collaboration between and among government agencies, NGOs operating in the area and other community-based organizations shall be encouraged and promoted. A strong partnership will facilitate referrals of cases to the right institutions and speedy resolution of the same. Another innovation would be to encourage people's participation and community volunteerism in social welfare undertakings of concerned government agencies, especially in the formulation and implementation of CHILD 21.
